### **Government School's Donations Scheme**

Our Board of Trustees voted to opt into the new Government Donations Scheme for schools in 2020.

This means that the school will receive additional funding of \$150 per child for agreeing to stop asking families/whanau for donations.

This means that in 2020 we will not ask families for a school donation.

The \$150.00 will be used to cover the costs of trips, class materials, visiting performances etc.

As St Mary's is a State integrated school the school donation scheme does not replace Attendance Dues. You must still pay attendance dues to the proprietor of a state integrated school to cover the cost of property-related matters – these remain compulsory.

We think that the new scheme will benefit everyone in our community, however we want to make sure that the we do not have to cut the number of opportunities we offer to children.

Under the new scheme, there are some costs that schools can still ask parents to contribute to:

- Overnight school camps will be exempted from the Donations Scheme, which means that Boards will still ask family/whanau for costs towards school camps that have an overnight component.
- Parents will continue to pay for extra-curricula music lessons provided at St Mary's School.
- Parents will be asked to pay for weekend and after hours sports teams as participation in these types of activities is voluntary and that participation incurs a charge.
- Parents will still be charged for the 'take-home' component of the Year 7/8 technology programme so that children can bring home the things that they make in woodwork, metalwork, food technology etc. We are working with Cullinane College to fine tune the details.

### What families/whānau need to know about school/kura donations

- If your child attends a decile 1 to 7 school or kura, the school board of trustees needs to decide each year whether it should opt-in or not to the Government's
- board agrees to opt in to the scheme AND

If your school/kura does not opt in to the donations scheme, the board may seek donations toward the cost of the core learning programme (curriculum). You can choose if you want to pay some, none or all of the donation. Schools/kura that have not opted in to the donations scheme may ask parents for a donation for any purpose

#### School/kura donations schemes

#### If your school/kura opts in to the donations scheme:

- » The board of trustees cannot ask you to make a donation unless it is for an overnight school/kura camp – and then you can choose if you want to pay none some or all of the donation. If you choose not to make a donation, your child cannot be stopped from attending a camp if it is part of the school's core learning programme (curriculum).
- » You cannot be asked to make either a general or specific donation e.g. a donatio for a day trip to a museum or a field trip to a hiking track

#### 2 If your school/kura doesn't opt in to the donations scheme:

- » They will not receive additional funding, so they can ask you to make a donation
- You can be asked to make either a general or specific donation (e.g. a donation for a day trip to a museum or a field trip to a hiking track). Donations are voluntar and so you can **choose** if you want to pay none, some or all of the donation. If you a camp or field trip if it is part of the core learning programme (curriculum).



#### Information for all parents/caregivers/whānau whether your school/kura is in the donations scheme or not

- programme (curriculum), including "subject fees."
- Your school or kura can ask you to pay for goods they provide that are optional (for example pens, lunches) but it is up to you whether you buy them from the school/kura or elsewhere.
- » If the school or kura has a uniform, you need to provide your child with one but you can choose to buy it from the school/kura or, if available, to buy a new or second hand uniform elsewhere
- You should not be pressured to buy goods or services from a school or kura but if you agree to buy a good or service, you must pay for it.
- a. If your child is involved in weekend sports teams or after hours cultural activities.

you may be asked to cover the costs of these activities.

» You can make a voluntary donation to your school or kura at any time and if you choose to do this, GST is not payable on the donation and you can claim a tax credit.

#### State integrated schools/kura attendance dues

- » State integrated schools and kura that are state integrated, have the same core learning programme as other schools and kura (the New Zealand Curric also their own special character (usually a philosophical or religious belief).
- You must pay attendance dues to the proprietor of a state integrated school or
- kura to cover the cost of property-related matters they are compulsory.
- » The maximum level of attendance dues cannot be increased without the app of the Minister of Education

Fees for enrolment are unlawful. As enrolment is free, there can be no charge for anything associated with the enrolment process.

Schools and kura cannot ask parents/whânau to pay for materials used in delivering the core learning programme (curriculum). This includes cooking ingredients for a food technology class. Food eaten as part of a food technology class is part of the core learning programme (curriculum) (sensory evaluation). Schools can charge parents/whānau for the cost of materials when they have agreed that the item

can be taken home - for example an item of clothing.

#### Kia Ora


