In this edition we have Katie's, from Room 8, stations of the cross. I'm sure you will agree that she is a superstar!



This Mass begins Holy Week where we bless the oils of learners (catechumens), the oil for the sick and consecrate the Chrism Oil, which we use when we baptise, confirm, ordain or bless a new altar. These oils are used within our parishes for the next year. Any unused oils are returned to the diocese at the next Chrism Mass. It is a very special Mass full of the special rituals of this season.











































We are having a house day tomorrow, where the students are working together in house groups to complete a Scavenger Hunt that is all about Holy Week and the trials that Jesus went through for us.



Aranga means to arise so goes appropriately with Jesus rising on Easter Sunday.




We have an amazing lady Mel who's on our staff who has created these stunning prayer rocks for our classrooms and prayer bags.


