#### Covid-19 Update

#### Kia ora koutou



As you will be aware the Government announced nationwide mandatory vaccination for the education workforce in order to work onsite as a means of protecting our students, you, your whanau and our staff

As the Principal, I am responsible for ensuring the Government's Health Orders are put into practice. All school staff, volunteers and contractors must have received their first vaccination by the 15th of November 2021 and be fully vaccinated by the 1st of January 2022.

The health and wellbeing of our students, staff and everyone involved in the safe operation of our school is something we take very seriously.

Under the Vaccination Order, those who wish to volunteer with students, attend school trips and camps must have received their first vaccination by yesterday the 15th of November 2021 and be fully vaccinated by the 1st of January 2022. You must provide proof of vaccination as I am required to keep a vaccination register and we will ask for evidence as needed. Your information will be kept confidential.

You do not need to show evidence of vaccination if you are dropping off, picking up children or visiting the office. We do ask if you need to come onsite to visit the office or a teacher that you wear a mask and sign in using the Covid Tracer app and the sign in book in the office.

We ask that you continue to support us by only coming onsite if it is absolutely necessary and that you have arranged this with us first.

# Gospel Values—I.C.I.C.

#### MĀIA- COURAGE

"Be on your guard, stand firm in the faith, be people of courage, stand strong" (1 Chronu6:13)

#### TAKING A STAND

I think of Matthew 21:12-13 when reflecting on taking a stand and having the courage to do it. Jesus was so appalled at the money-lenders being in his Father's house, that he got angry and forceful. Hard to picture him being like this when we see all the gentle pictures of Jesus.

We have a society that takes a stand on a lot of issues: 3 water reform, vaccinations, black lives matter, global warming, LGBTQIA+. We, as Christians, are called to take a stand too - for the rejected, poor, lonely, sick, oppressed. He also wants us to stand up for ourselves and those we love. Most importantly, in an age where Our Father is ignored more and more, we need to stand up for God, to speak of Him when others reject God. We look at the early apostles who stood up for their Christian faith and shared Jesus teachings to others - the sacrifices they gave.

When and how do you stand up for yourself? When and how do you stand up for others? Do you stand up and proclaim your faith to others? Yes it needs courage to do this, but the rewards are heavenly!

### **Christ the King**

This Sunday (Nov 21st) marks the end of the Catholic Church's liturgical year concluding with the feast of Christ the King. It was



instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to celebrate the Jubilee Year and the 16th centenary of the Council of Nicaea. Instituting this feast, Pope Pius XI proclaimed: "Pax Christi in regno Christi" ("The peace of Christ in the reign of Christ"). When Jesus was on earth, many of His followers thought that He was going to be a normal sort of king, with a kingdom and soldiers and everything. But that wasn't the case. Before He died, Jesus said that His kingdom was not in this world. Do you know where Jesus' kingdom is? It is not just in Heaven, but I the soul of every person who follows Jesus. Do you try to be like Jesus? Is He your king?



Sunday the 28th November is the first Sunday of Advent. So set up your Advent wreath. The Advent wreath is part of our long-standing Catholic tradition. Traditionally, Advent wreaths hold four coloured candles, lit one by one through the four weeks of the season. These candles represent in order: hope, love, joy, and peace. Each is purple except the pink, which represents joy. A fifth candle, the white Christ candle, is first lit on Christmas Eve or on Christmas Day.

Advent wreaths are a great way to mark the Advent season and involve your household in the process. Make yours now!




