

In many parts of Aotearoa, people celebrate the Māori New Year when Matariki a group of stars appears. However, some iwi such as those here in Whanganui celebrate Puanga rather than Matariki because Matariki is hard to see as it's very low in the eastern sky. Puanga is a very bright star that can be seen above the three stars named Tautoru or Orion's Belt.

Puanga/Matariki is a time to come together, share kai and remember those who have passed, celebrating the living while looking forward to the future.

Ongoing symptoms after being away sick

If a student returns to school and is generally well but still has a cough they are able to stay at school. If in doubt please ring lvy and she will be able to give you advice.

From the Ministry of Health

For COVID-19, colds and flus and potentially other illnesses, a child may continue to have minor but lingering symptoms such as a runny nose or minor cough.

- Anyone who is sick should stay home until they are well.
- When a child has respiratory symptoms, they should stay at home and seek advice from their GP or Healthline. Staying home is key to controlling the spread of any virus in a school setting.
- Many children will have a long-lasting runny nose or cough after viral infections. If it has been more than 10 days since the onset of symptoms and they are no longer feeling unwell, they are very unlikely to be infectious and can therefore return to school.
- However, if they are continuing to feel unwell or their symptoms are worsening after 10 days, they should not return to school. A GP review or a call to Healthline is recommended.

The diocese wishes to thank all those who contributed to the local phase of SYNOD 2021-2023, for opening their hearts and minds to the Holy Spirit and engaging in this process.

Around 230 submissions were received from groups and individuals. It is estimated that these submissions involved around 500 participants. Participants reflected the diversity of the diocese, including through ethnicity, age, gender, vocation, spirituality, and connection to the Church.

DIOCESAN SYNTHESIS DOCUMENT

This synthesis document is the culmination of communal spiritual discernment. It aims to express the fruits of the synodal process, indicating how the Holy Spirit's call to the Church has been understood in the local context.

This synthesis document is the contribution of the Diocese of Palmerston North to the local phase of \$7 NOD 2021-2023 and was provided to the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference on 10 June 2022.

WHAT'S NEXT?

The SYNOD 2021-2023 process now enters the final stage of the local phase. This involves the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference hosting a national Pre-Synod Hui and drafting of a national synthesis document by August 2022.

"to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarkelling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people." (Titus 3:2)



To be courteous is to be patient with others "Patience is a virtue." We're all familiar with that cliché, and many of us know that patience is listed by Paul in Galatians 5:22-23 as among the fruit of the Spirit. To be patient is to endure discomfort without complaint. This calls into play some other virtues, specifically, self-control, humility, and generosity.

An example from the life of Christ illustrates this. Jesus was very patient with his disciples. They were sometimes struggling to understand, lazy, selfish, and slow to believe. In spite of Jesus' miracles and words of wisdom, they were focused upon themselves and wavered in their belief about who he really was. To say that was uncomfortable for Jesus would be an understatement. Yet do we find him railing at his disciples over their foolishness and stupidity? Or making fun of them when they make mistakes? No He was patient with them while also challenging them.

Nominations close at **noon** on *the 3rd of August 2022.*You may provide a signed candidate statement and photograph with your nomination.


The electoral roll is held at the school and can be viewed during normal school hours.

Voting closes at 4pm on 7th of September 2022






