We are at the end of Term 1 already. What a fantastic term we have had. It's wonderful to see our settled learners consistently making excellent choices, both during lessons and in the playground.

Every year we update our strategic and annual plan. Our path forward is determined through a collaborative process that considers the requirements of the Palmerston North Diocese and the Ministry of Education, alongside the crucial input of your voice, student voice, and teacher voice.

In a nutshell...

- Religious education, Tō Tātou Whakapono Our Faith. The implementation of our new curriculum over the last year has provided us with the opportunity to keep embedding effective planning, tracking, assessment and evaluation of the programme.
- Celebrating our diversity. We have some exciting plans unfolding over the year to celebrate our many unique cultures. Watch this space.
- Our staff are experiencing a large amount of change and I am so proud of them! As you may know from recent news, we have a new refreshed curriculum. You will also have heard about Structured Literacy and Structured Maths. Our staff have worked through, are working through and will be working through the Better Start Literacy Approach and Numicon to support structured Maths. It is essential that we proceed through these changes with care that we do not lose good practice and we embed new learning to enhance teaching and learning.
- Assessment changes ahead. We currently use a variety of tools to assess students and
  differentiate their learning to suit their needs. These tools are changing over the next year so
  our priority is to keep providing you with a clear picture of where your child is achieving. We
  continue to provide a mid year report and an end of year report. Remember if you have any
  concerns you are always welcome to contact your classroom teacher and ask for a meeting at
  any time.
- Healthy Active Learning. We continue our work with Sport Whanganui to plan and provide a
  positive and inclusive learning experience for all students within the Health and Physical
  Education learning area.
- Attendance. The Ministry of Education has set a target of having 80% of students attending school regularly by 2030, aiming to address declining attendance rates through initiatives like the Stepped Attendance Response (STAR) and focusing on interventions for chronic nonattenders. We will be working through this process from Term 2 this year.

#### Staff Only Days Heads Up:

As part of our professional development we have three Staff Only Days this year. We absolutely understand the pressure this places on you but unfortunately we are reliant on the avaliability of outside providers. Over the past few years we have managed to hold professional development in non contact time where possible which reduced the impact for you. Unfortunately this year our hands are tied.





## We need your help...


We have a lot of bugs floating around and they are spreading.
