



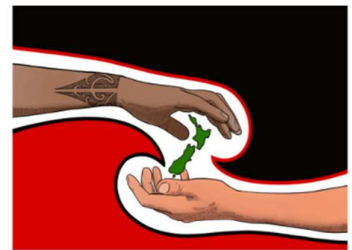

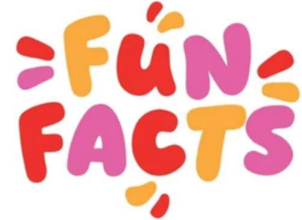

Pancake Tuesday, also known as **Shrove Tuesday**, is the day before Ash Wednesday and the start of Lent. Traditionally, it was a time to use up rich foods such as eggs, milk, and sugar before the Lenten season of fasting and simplicity began. Shrove Tuesday reminds us to prepare our hearts for Lent by saying sorry, forgiving others, and getting ready to turn back to God.

Families are warmly invited to join us for our School **Ash Wednesday Liturgy** in the hall on **Wednesday 18th March** at 11.45.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a 40-day journey of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as we prepare our hearts for Easter. On this day, ashes are placed on our foreheads as a sign of humility, reminding us to turn back to God, seek forgiveness, and renew our commitment to live with love, compassion, and faith.



Lent is a special season in the Church that lasts for 40 days, leading up to Easter. It is a time for reflection, prayer, and growing closer to God. During Lent, we are invited to make positive choices through prayer, fasting, and acts of kindness, helping us prepare our hearts to celebrate the joy of Jesus' resurrection at Easter

Families are invited to join Caritas on a six-week journey of faith, learning to listen to God's voice and respond with love and action.

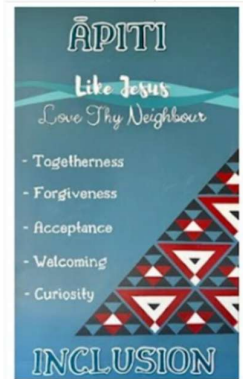

Students learn about God as Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—and come to understand that God is a loving mystery who cannot be fully explained. Through Jesus, God the Son, students learn about love, forgiveness, and how to build a personal relationship with Christ, who is alive and present with us today. Through God the Holy Spirit, students discover how God works in our lives, guiding us to live with truth, justice, and love as we serve others.
